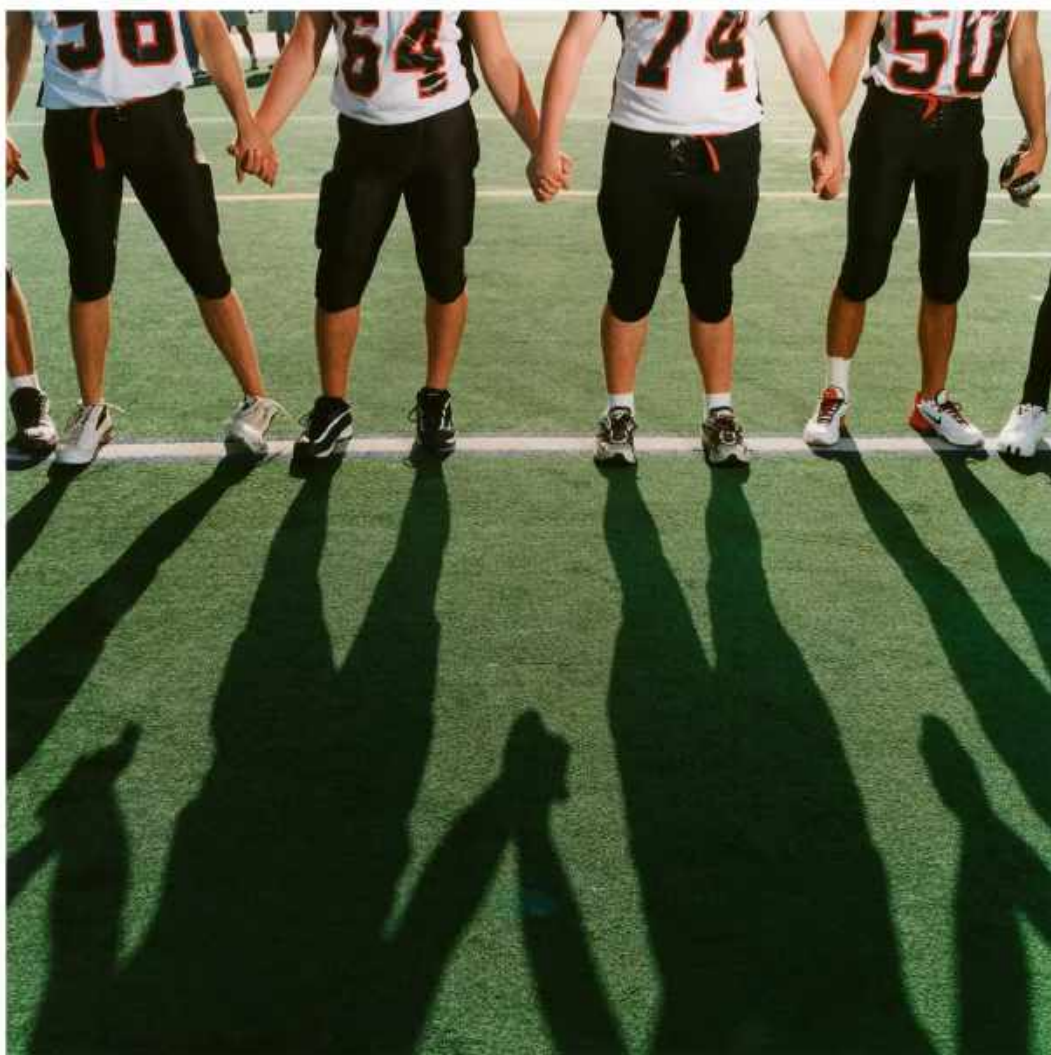
Football, officially called Gridiron Football or American Football originated in the late 19th century. It is closely related to the ancient English sports Rugby and Soccer. In 1869 players from Princeton and Rutgers held the first intercollegiate football game. In the 1870's the game was referred to as "Boston Game" and considered a rugby-soccer hybrid game. Walter Camp was a student at Yale and played as a halfback and served as team captain. He is now referred to as the "Father of American Football", he was an important figure in creating the rules, he innovated the 11 man team, the quarterback position, the line of scrimmage, offensive signaling and the scoring scale used. In 1920 the American Professional Football Association was formed, and later known as the National Football League. The game has become the most popular sport in the United States with 32 member teams in the NFL, over 830 college football teams and thousands of leagues and teams for younger players.

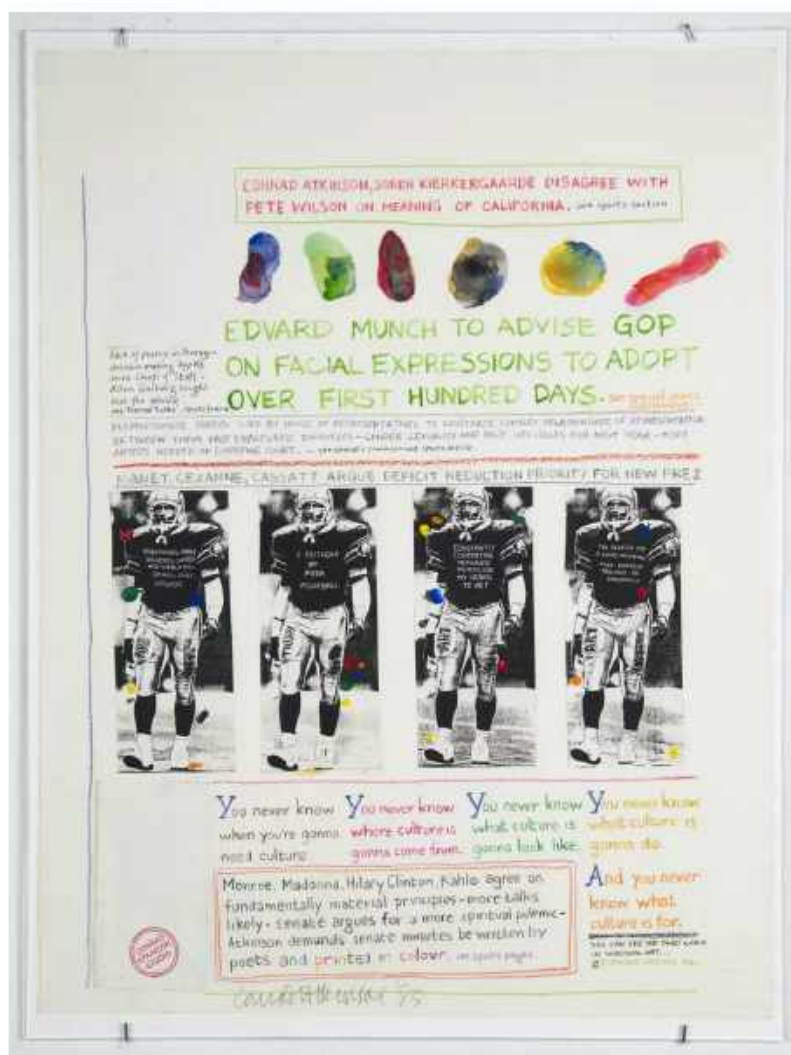

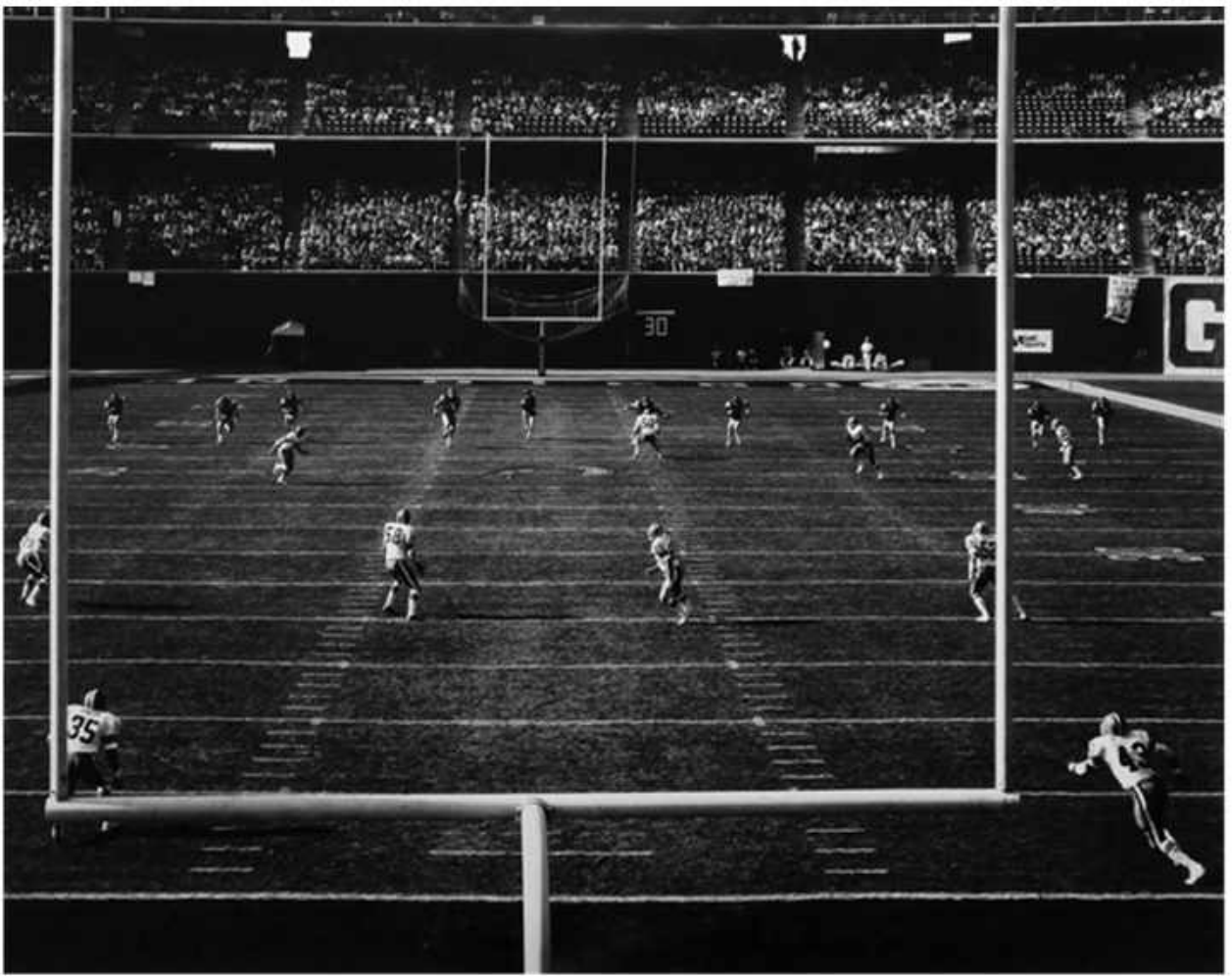

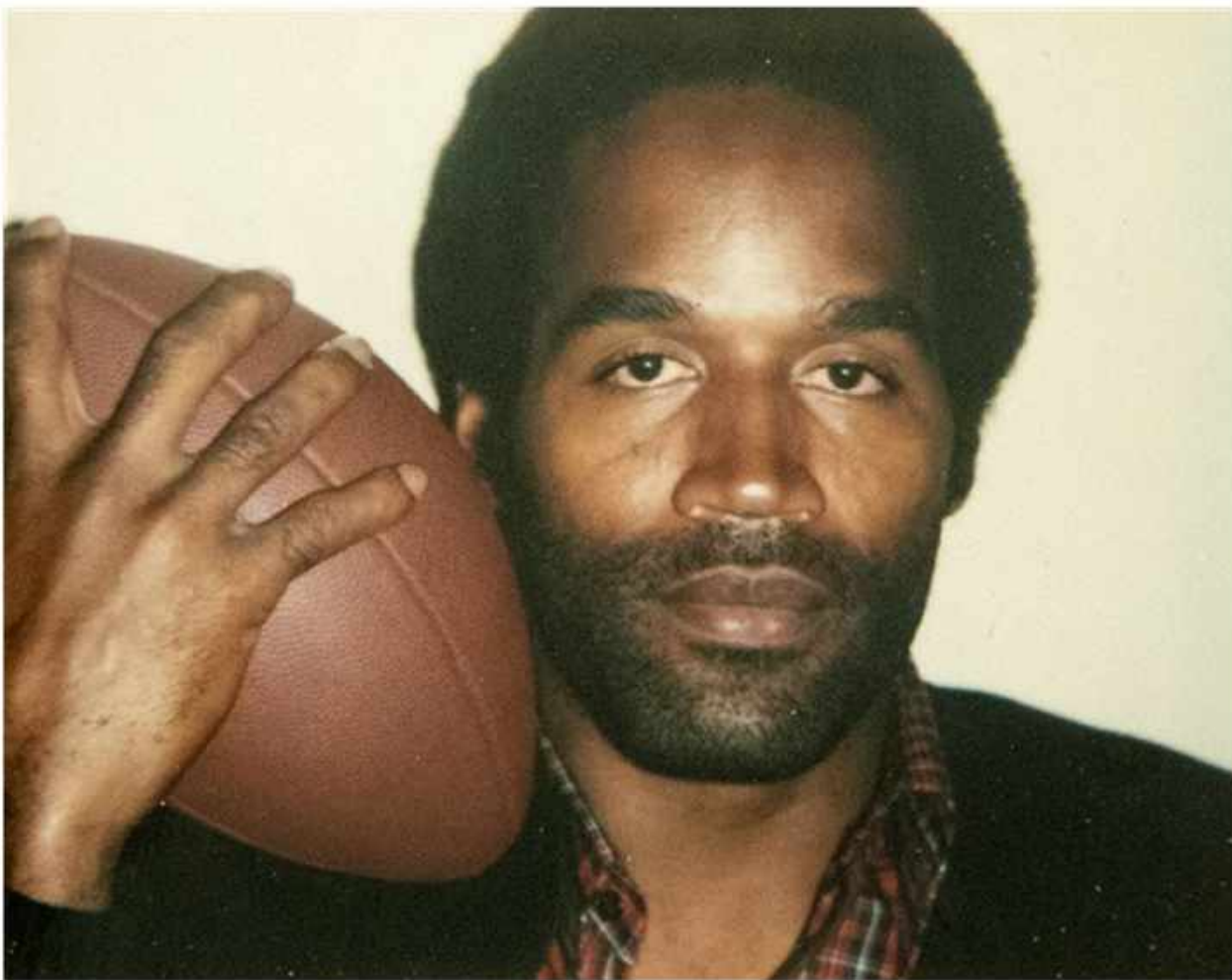

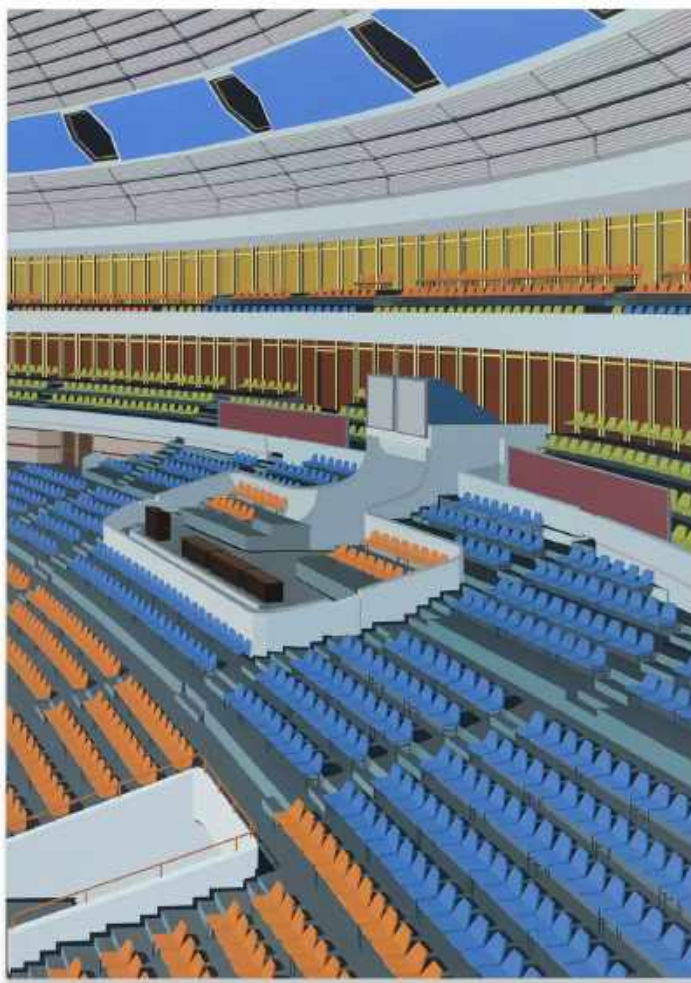
