Seasons change on Earth because the planet is slightly tilted on its axis as it travels around the Sun. This means different points on Earth receive more or less sunlight at different times of the year. There are four celestial events that determine the start of seasons. An equinox is an event in which a planet's sub solar point passes through its Equator. The equinoxes are the only time when both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres experience roughly equal amounts of daytime and nighttime. On Earth, there are two equinoxes every year, the vernal equinox, around March 21 and another the autumnal equinox around September 22. Solstices are the days when the Sun's path in the sky is the farthest north or south from the Equator. The winter solstice marks the start of winter, at this point the South Pole is tilted closest to the Sun, it is the shortest day of the year and occurs around December 21. The summer solstice occurs around June 20, this is when the North Pole is tilted closest to the sun.




